As most of you know, water is my thing. I have been fortunate to be part of the S.F.I. reference group who worked towards redirecting the \$15.3 million dollars of State funding to drought proof our region. The State Government in conjunction with DPIRP have released a grant funding round of \$10 million in the Southern Forests Infrastructure Support Scheme. This grant supports horticulturalists to drought proof themselves on farm. The grant round is only open for three months, so get onto it today. Although the opening round is for horticulturalists, in light of this year's season, I will personally be pushing for any leftover funds to be made available to all farming bodies to be able to secure water for our region.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Old Vasse Road Upgrade

At the meeting on 14 April, Council voted to instruct the Chief Executive Officer to:

- 1.Continue with the current approved and funded 2023/24 works program for bitumen sealing of Old Vasse Road from, and including, the Hawke Road intersection and then continuing approximately 1km towards Vasse Highway.
- 2.Continue to seek any necessary approvals or permits required for the sealing of the section Old Vasse Road from Hawke Road to Vasse Highway, including the intersection of Old Vasse Road and Vasse Highway.
- 3.Undertake consultation with the community in relation to the remaining section of road from Hawke Road back to the Pemberton/Northcliffe Road.
- 4. Present the results of the community consultation to Council, for Council to resolve through the Road Infrastructure Committee further action/s on the project by no later than September 2024.


