**Looking ahead in 2021**

We continue to be COVID Safe and the Shire has a thorough COVID Business Continuity Plan ready to be implemented immediately if needed, the plan ensures the continuation of essential services should an outbreak occur

This year we will see the following major projects - Pemberton Colocation building construction, air conditioner upgrade at the AquaCentre, Pioneer Park Walpole toilet upgrade, a new toilet block near the Pemberton Mill Hall, preparation for the redevelopment of the Rea Park and Collier Street Reserve, pathways and furniture at Quinninup dam, and major bridge works on Mordalup Road. We are bringing free wi-fi to Pemberton, Northcliffe and Walpole CBD's upgrades to the Northcliffe basketball courts and a pathway to Clem Collins Stadium. There are many smaller projects on the go as well as the tremendous amount of work that goes into the normal operations of a local government.
