The Strategic Community Plan captures and outlines the Shire community's long-term (10 year +) vision, values, aspirations and priorities with reference to other Shire of Manjimup plans, State and Federal Government plans, information and resourcing capability. Its priorities and goals have been driven by community engagement and it takes a 'whole of shire' approach.

Youth Engagement

Recent grant funding from Foundation for Rural Regional Renewal Tackling Tough Times Together (\$60,000), and the Criminal Property Confiscation Grants Program (\$95,053), along with \$41,074 from the Shire of Manjimup, has enabled the Shire to commit to a Youth Engage and Empower Project.

The project aims to support youth mental health and resilience, assist youth to develop a sense of community belonging and engagement, develop leadership and life skills and support the development of the local youth services sector.

The project is a collaboration between the Shire of Manjimup, youth groups, schools and youth agencies and focuses on young people from the age of 12 upwards to 25 years old
