



Background & Issues

Occasionally storms and other events cause topsoil and associated debris to wash from agricultural properties onto road reserves. This policy determines the responsibilities for providing costs to clean up affected road reserves after such an event.

Objectives

To determine the responsibilities for payment for cleaning up after topsoil and associated debris have washed from agricultural properties onto road reserves.

Area of Application

The Shire of Manjimup.

Policy Measures

1. Property owners are responsible for paying all costs for Council to make good and remove any topsoil or associated debris that washes from their property onto roads or related infrastructure.
2. If, by agreement with a Shire Works Supervisor, a property owner elects to arrange rectification works themselves, then they will have seven (7) days from the damage occurring to complete the works. If the works are not completed to Council standards in this timeframe, the Shire may arrange for the completion of the works at the full cost of the property owner.
3. The CEO may reduce or waive the payment requirement of Clause 1 after considering an application from the owner which demonstrates a prior genuine attempt to prevent erosion by¹:
 - a. Ensuring the crops were planted on slopes flatter than 10% - 15% gradient;
 - b. Minimising the number of cultivations and using “soil-friendly” implements;
 - c. Protecting the soil surface by retaining crop residues, planting cover crops or spreading surface mulch;
 - d. Maintaining or improving soil biological health by mulch cropping or adding soil amendments;
 - e. Undertaking surface water control earthworks; or
 - f. Installing windbreaks
4. The CEO may reduce or waive the payment requirement of Clause 1 if the storm was of particularly high intensity (eg. greater than a “5 year ARI” [ie. a “1 in 5 year”] storm).
